From the Desk of the Rabbi...

Everything today is becoming more and more complicated: cell phones, computers, TVs, and even cars. It feels as if we can't have anything simple today without totally dumbing it down.

Is that also true with Judaism and religion as well? Theology and ritual may be complex, but clarifying the basics—neither ignoring nor obfuscating—should be our objective.

The Holy Day season and a new year on the Jewish calendar is a good time to review the set policies of *kashrut* at TBY. We do not require kosher meat, nor separate dishes, nor the many regulations and restrictions of traditional practice. Reform Judaism allows personal autonomy to decide which practices to follow at home or in the community. However, TBY as a synagogue community has to respect a minimum of practice within the wider realm of Judaic expectations, and so we have adhered to the following:

- ► No pork, bacon products nor shellfish are permitted.
- ► A pot luck dinner casserole cannot have both dairy & meat.
- ▶ Dairy & meat may be offered at the same time, if served:
- ► on separate plates, set apart [at end or another table]
 - **▶** and other food choices are available.

These basic criteria have helped us successfully function as a Reform Temple with an overwhelming consensus of liberal practice. What we choose individually at home may be different from what our congregation observes because TBY makes a statement about all of us and other Jews. If you have questions about appropriate foods, whether at a meeting function, service or Holiday meal, or any event, feel free to contact me in advance.
