"Al Shlosha Devarim Ha Olam Omed: Al Ha Torah Be al hahavoda ve al guemilut (hasadim."

Every time we do a hakafa (A Torah procession) we sing the above words. Those teachings were taught by Shimon HaZaddik (the righteous). They mean: "The world stands on three things: Al ha Torah, al ha Avodah, v'al gemilut hasadim." "On Torah, on worship, and on acts of loving-kindness."

Temple Bet Yam closed a great 2021! In December, the congregation celebrated Hannukah together in person, with facemasks, while also on Zoom. Then, the Religious School held a Hannukah picnic at Treaty Park for the students and their families, with lots of food, games, Hannukah lessons and, of course, menorah lighting.

This month America is celebrating Martin Luther King's Jr. Day. I have learned that Rev. King was a person who spoke for nonviolent activism in the civil rights movement, which successfully protested racial discrimination in federal and state law. I have also learned that President Ronald Reagan signed the holiday into law in 1983. It was officially observed in all 50 states for the first time in 2000. Rev. King was killed the same year that I was born. I learned that he preached the verses from our Torah.

Our Torah always teaches us to take care of the stranger, the widow, and the orphan. Some of those verses are:

"You shall have one standard for the stranger and the citizen alike: for I, the Eternal, am your God." (Leviticus 24:22)

"For the citizen among the Israelites and for the resident who resides among them—you shall have one ritual for anyone who acts in error." (Numbers 15:29)

Our Jewish sages taught: for the sake of peace, non-Jewish poor should be supported as we support the poor of Israel, the non-Jewish sick should be visited as we visit the sick of Israel, and the non-Jewish dead should be buried as we bury the dead of Israel. (Gittin 59a-61a)

That is why, in the month that America is celebrating Social Action, I encourage ev-eryone to think about a mitzvah (a good deed) project that you would like to do. Please think about it, do it, and share it with your friends.



Let's always remember to improve our world by learning and practicing Torah!


